- Rainbow Babies and Children's Hospital in Cleveland, Ohio
 - 1993-94: ten infants become very sick






- Center for Disease Control Investigation
 - Focus on Stachybotrys
 - 1997 CDC report:
 infants with
 pulmonary
 hemorrhage more
 likely to live in
 homes with
 Stachybotrys

- 1990: CDC recants study
 - Association between children's illness and black mold not proven




- CDC's official position today:
 - Causal link between presence of toxic mold and pulmonary hemorrhaging and memory loss has not been proven





- Reno, Nevada, suit:
 - 380 homeowners in low lying subdivision
 - homes allegedly built without proper drainage
 - All homes tested positive for mold
 - Crawlspaces built below grade, with improper drainage and waterproofing problems

- Reno case II:
 - Office building landlord attempt to remedy Stachybotrys
 - Cut out mold and place fans in the space to dry out the area
 - Fans spread mold throughout the building




- North Dallas:
 - Saratoga SpringsApartments
 - Residents had to pack and move in March 2001 due to toxic mold
 - Some residents

 instructed to move out as
 fast as they could gather
 necessary belongings,
 while others had a month



- Some Saratoga
 Springs Apartment
 Residents
 - Unable to find new apartments
 - Blackballed for black mold





- Newport Beach, CA:
 - Two women sue former landlord
 - Toxic mold in apartment made them ill
 - 11 types of mold growing under carpets and unit closet compromised their immune systems
 - From inhaling the mold and spores, one woman had at least 16 fungal masses, including one of golf ball size in her lungs

- Woodlands, Texas,
 November 1993
 - Larry and AldaBrunson's dreamhouse
 - EIFS construction led to Stachybotrys
 - Daughter almost died



- Very little exists
 - Pena v. State Farm Lloyds, 980 S.W.2d 949 (Tex.App. — Corpus Christi 1998, no writ)
 - Insurance coverage for fungal growth on underside of wooden planks and flooring from plumbing leak



- Home Insurance Co.
 v. McClain, 2000 WL
 144115 (Tex.App. —
 Dallas, Feb. 10,
 2000)
 - coverage found for mold and fungi growing from accidental discharge of water



- Balandran v. Safeco Insurance Company of America, 972 S.W.2d 738 (Tex. 1998)
 - Plumbing leaks may damage foundations
 - Foundation damage covered under standard form homeowner's policy





- Ensuing Loss:
 - McKool v. Reliance
 Insurance Co., 386
 S.W.2d 344, 345-46
 (Tex.Civ.App. —
 Dallas 1965, writ
 dism'd)
 - Freeze damage to swimming pool tiles not covered as ensuing loss

- Ensuing Loss:
 - Merrimack Mutual
 Fire Insurance Co. v.
 McCAffree, 486
 S.W.2d 616
 (Tex.Civ.App. —
 Dallas 1972, writ ref'd n.r.e.)
 - Damage to property directly caused by fungi excluded due to improper building construction



- Ensuing Loss:
 - Aetna Casualty & Surety Co. v. Yates, 344 F.2d 939, 941 (5th Cir. 1965)
 - Ensuing losses caused by water damage are covered losses, but rot is excluded



- Sewer Backup
 - State Farm Lloyds v.
 Marchetti, 962 S.W.2d 58
 (Tex.App. Houston [1st Dist.] 1997, writ denied)
 - Court: when loss from invasion of insured premises by non-flood water, even though invasion may be proximately caused by flood water, the "flood or surface water" exclusion does not apply



- Plumbing Leaks
 - Oram v. State Farm Lloyds, 977 S.W.2d 163 (Tex.App. — Austin 1998, no writ)
 - Damages from plumbing leak are covered losses under homeowner's policy



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
